ENAIRE and COPAC push for improved air operations after analysing 600 flight observations from pilots and controllers

- The Governance Committee of the Observatory for Air
 Operations Safety and Efficiency analyses the results from
 2020 and plans the actions for 2021 at its first annual meeting.
- The Governance Committee approved doubling down on outreach activities through a development portal and meetings with stakeholders.
- The review committees of the five major Spanish airports are collaborating in this initiative endorsed by EUROCONTROL, and for which 55 pilots from eleven airlines have been trained as observers.

The Governing Committee of the Air Operations Safety and Efficiency Observatory, made up of representatives of ENAIRE and the Official Association of Commercial Aviation Pilots (COPAC), met today to analyse the results from 2020 and plan the actions for 2021. The attendees reviewed the more than 600 observations that will be used to improve air operations in Spanish airspace.

The Observatory was created in 2019 with the aim of identifying inefficiencies and best operating practices by having the professionals involved in air operations (pilots and controllers) gather information directly, and systematising their joint analysis in an effort to improve the safety and efficiency of aviation in Spanish airspace.

The scope of the Observatory's activities, which was recognised in 2020 by the European network manager, EUROCONTROL, are flights that land at and/or take off from the five busiest Spanish airports: Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas, Josep Tarradellas Barcelona-El Prat, Palma de Mallorca, Málaga Costa del Sol and Gran Canaria.

The Observatory works by having pilots collect data associated with their flights, and having the controllers conduct a cross-sectional analysis of the operations. The results of these actions are then shared in the so-called Event Review Committees (one per airport) in order to identify and disseminate best practices. To this end, 55 pilots from 11 airlines have been trained as observers.

Another goal of the Observatory is to improve the mutual knowledge of operations between pilots and controllers, as well as to promote collaboration and transparency in the field of aviation. To this end, for 2021 the Governance Committee approved expanding the observations, as allowed by the recovery in air traffic, as well as strengthening the outreach activities through a development portal and meetings with stakeholders.
